What should we do next?

1. Vote.

The people we have in office now were elected by us to be there. Voting is one way we can have better politicians in office running our country.

2. Mutual Aid.

This can include volunteering in an official or unofficial capacity. We can help our neighbors get to the polls and remind them and encourage them to vote. Help them access basic needs such as food, water, clothing, and shelter.

What are our demands?

1. An end to persecution.

We are suffering because of the hatred our neighbors have towards migrants who struggle simply for the betterment of themselves and their families.

2. The restoration of our rights.

From the foundation of our country, we have rights detailed in the Bill of Rights in our constitution which apply for all people in the United States regardless of legal status. Our constitutional rights are the conditions of civility and peace. They can't take them away!

3. Affordable healthcare and higher education.

We shouldn't have to go bankrupt over healthcare costs or take out predatory loans for our education. The country can choose to better our healthcare and education for the betterment of all the people and the country as a whole.

4. Housing.

We have more houses than people in this country and people are still homeless and homes are still vacant!

5. Clean air and water.
